





#### The King of Rock & Roll.

Elvis Aaron Presley was born on January 8, 1935, in Tupelo, Mississippi. His twin brother died at birth. His parents were very

poor, so he never had music lessons. In 1948, when he was thirteen, they moved to Memphis. He left school in 1953 and got a job as a lorry driver. That summer he paid \$4 and recorded two songs for his mother's birthday at Sam Phillips's studio. Sam Phillips heard him, and asked him to record 'That's alright'. He sold 20.000 copies in a year! He made five more records and he earned \$5.000. With the money he bought a pink Cadillac for his mother. During the following years he made a lot of records and they were all big hits. In 1960 he went to Hollywood where he made 33 successful films. But he worked too hard, and he ate and drank too much, and he probably took drugs. He died from a heart attack at his Memphis home on August 16, 1977. His death, at the age of 42, shocked his fans worldwide. He is still the best-selling solo artist in the history of pop music.

Loch Ness, near Inverness in the north of Scotland, is the deepest lake in Britain. It's about 290 metres deep in some places. The lake is also very dark, so you can't take good underwater pictures. The lake is famous for its monster, Nessie. Although nobody can prove that it exists, it brings in the tourists. The first recorded sighting of Nessie was in 565 AD, then nothing until 1930. People say Nessie has a long neck, brown or grey skin and a large head. Some people think there is more than one monster, and they are 6-8 metres long. One popular theory is that Nessie is a dinosaur of the plesiosaur family which became extinct 70 million years ago.
